'Facebook' for criminals

**Victim outrage
at new social
website for
prisoners**

Prisoners are using a new social networking site to post sensitive information, protest their innocence and look for love on the outside.

The world-first site, iexpress.org.au, has been established by prisoner advocacy group Justice Action to help inmates' rehabilitation by providing a platform for self-expression and aspiration. The group uploads images and words from prisoners and sets up a personal email address for contact with the public.

But the family of one murder victim was shocked and upset to learn he had used his page to argue his innocence of charges.

Corrective Services NSW does not support the project because of the "potential adverse impact on victims".

Victims rights campaigner Ken Marslew said he supports the project but had reservations about its potential to be abused.
